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A Bit of Background

Faced with a steady rise in student enrollment, the residents of Robbinsville Township voted to authorize a building referendum for Robbinsville Schools in a special election held on December 11, 2012. The project consisted of renovations to and expansion of Pond Road and Sharon Schools leaving the district enough space to educate students into the foreseeable future. Prior to securing voter approval, however, the district invested in a standalone, five classroom modular classroom building that is now available to house non-resident students for kindergarten on a tuition basis.

Robbinsville has a long history of providing an outstanding full day kindergarten program for district students. The ability to offer this experience to non-resident students through the KindeRville program creates a win-win situation for resident and non-resident families since it provides a needed service to neighboring communities and will generate revenue to improve district programs.

Priced competitively in the kindergarten market, KindeRville promises to prepare students well for first grade making the opportunity a strong investment for neighboring families. Tuition students will be enrolled as district students for kindergarten opening them to a comprehensive and rewarding Sharon School experience.

Curriculum Initiatives

KindeRville provides students with a developmentally appropriate foundation for learning through academics and is balanced with play.

- Wilson Foundations - Provides phonological/phonemic awareness incorporating a 30-minute daily lesson into their language arts classroom instruction
- Readers Workshop - Fosters a love of reading by encouraging students to choose their own books and provides meaningful time for independent reading
- Writers Workshop - Builds fluency in writing through continuous, repeated exposure to the process of writing
- Everyday Math - Ensures student mastery of key math concepts by revisiting content in a variety of contexts and helping students see real world connections in math
- Inquiry-Based Science – Integrates literacy and math with science teaching and learning
- Special Subject Area Studies - Include Physical Education, Music, Art, Technology



Why Full Day Kindergarten?

- Longitudinal data demonstrate that children in full-day kindergarten classes show greater reading and mathematics achievement gains than those in half-day classes. (Walston and West)
- Teachers have more time to get to know kids and to identify and address their learning challenges early, increasing the odds that children will be successful later in school. (Center for Evaluation & Education Policy)
- Full-day kindergarten offers social, emotional and intellectual benefits to students, giving them more time to focus and reflect on activities, and transition between them. (National Institute for Early Education Research)
- Full-day kindergarten provides a bridge between prekindergarten programs and more structured learning in first grade. (Education Commission of the States)
- A full-day program, coupled with excellent after-care (R.E.D.) is practical and convenient for working families.

Monthly Tuition

- The tuition rate for the KindeRville full day non-resident kindergarten program is \$800 per month.
- A non-refundable (except in the event of district cancellation) deposit in the amount of \$400 is due at time of registration.
- A 10 month payment plan will be in effect beginning August 1, 2015.
- Payments can be made by accessing the [Robbinsville Schools Web Store](#) or by check made payable to the Robbinsville Board of Education.
- The final tuition payment of the 2015-2016 school year, due on May 15, 2016, will total \$400. The initial \$400 deposit will be applied to the student's account at this time.

2. Expect an email within 2-3 business days confirming registration and payment as well as a link directing you to some additional forms, i.e. Allergy Questionnaire, Health Records, etc.

- Open to children of neighboring districts who will be five years of age by October 1, 2015
- Space limited – First come, first served
- KindeRville will be taught by certified tenure track Robbinsville teachers
- The school day starts at 8:55AM and dismisses at 3:40PM
- Transportation to and from program is unavailable
- Parents can opt to enroll students in the Robbinsville Extended Day program (R.E.D), our in-house before and after care program (7:00 AM – 6:30 PM)
